You will read, at least, two independent reading books over the summer.
One is required. One you will choose from the recommended reading list.

Required Book Assignment

Since one major concept of *The Giver* focuses on the importance of memories, you are going to be creating Jonah's memory scrapbook using images and symbols to represent different aspects of the novel.

Your scrapbook will consist of 10 significant moments told from the perspective of Jonah **and** 6 symbols. You can design this scrapbook any way you wish to make it a visually pleasing and cohesive display. You do not need to put each moment and symbol on a separate page.

Your scrapbook must have a cover page that includes a title for your project, the title of the novel (*The Giver*), and your name.

Section 1: Significant Moments of *The Giver*

Your scrapbook will contain 10 significant moments; two from each of the following chapter groupings. 1-5; 6-10; 11-15; 16-20; 21-23.

Each significant moment must include:

- 1) An item, sketch, or image of the moment.
- 2) A short description of each moment from the perspective of Jonah. Imagine that this scrapbook is told from his perspective.

This is when I.... This is a picture of me doing... This is a picture of ...

When I think about this moment, I realize... etc.

- 3) For each description please include a directly cited quotation from the book with a page number included that you referenced to develop your description.

Section 2: Symbols

Each symbol must be printed out or neatly drawn

You will have 6 symbols. Each symbol must contain 4 items:

- 1) A title at the top (these are in bold below)
- 2) A picture of the symbol you chose (can be drawn or printed)



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3) The name of the symbol you chose (i.e. teddy bear, coffee mug, etc)

4) A description of why you chose that symbol and how it represents the section

Symbol 3: Jonas' Journey, Characterization – Middle Symbol I chose _____ Characterize Jonas in the middle of the novel and explain the cause of the change from the beginning. Explain why you chose this symbol:

Symbol 4: Jonas' Journey, Characterization – End Symbol I chose _____ Characterize Jonas at the end of the novel and explain the cause of the change from the beginning and middle. Explain why you chose this symbol:

Symbol 5: Jonas' Main Conflict Symbol I chose _____ The main conflict is.... Describe the conflict in your own words.

Symbol 6: Resolution Symbol I chose _____ What is the resolution in the novel? You must describe your own interpretation here and explain why you chose this symbol:

Make sure that your scrapbook is neat and visually appealing. You may bind it any functional way that you wish. I encourage you to be creative and think outside of the box with this project.

Be prepared to present and explain your scrapbook to the class.

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Self Selected Book from Recommended Reading List Assignment

You will select a book from your grade level recommended reading list.

After you have read it, please create a postcard for it and mail it back to the school.


On the front of the postcard, please include the title of the book, the author, and an illustration to represent the book. Think of this as an opportunity to redesign the cover of the book. Your postcard will show how you would represent the main idea of the book on a cover if you could design the book cover.

On the back of the postcard, please use the following template.

My name is (please include your first and last name). I chose to read (please include the book title) because (please explain why you chose to read this book.)

In one to two sentences, please share your reaction to the book. Did you like it? What did you like? Would you recommend it? Why or Why not? These questions are just to give you ideas; you can provide your own 1-2 sentence reaction. You do not have to answer all of these questions.
