Required Book Assignment

During your summer reading you will read the book *Where is the Grand Canyon?* and create a page for each of your assigned nine letters. For each of your letters, you will need to find a word or short phrase from the book that begins with that letter. Then, in 3-4 complete sentences you will explain your word or phrase and how it relates to the Grand Canyon. Please use the format below to guide you as you write.


Your informational sentences should follow the following format:

- 1. In a complete sentence, give the definition for your word or phrase
- 2. Explain how this word or phrase relates to the Grand Canyon
- 3. Use your word or phrase in a complete sentence of your own

Over the summer, you should use the attached chart to draft the informational sentences. Then, when you return from the summer break, you will use this draft and collaborate with classmates to create your alphabet book. See the example page below.

Example Explanation:

Indigo is a plant that is often used to make indigo colored dye. Indigo relates to slavery and the Underground Railroad because in the 1700's this crop was often grown on plantations that used slave labor to harvest it. The cruel treatment on these plantations caused many slaves to run away using the Underground Railroad. Example sentence: In the 1700's more than one million pounds of indigo were harvested a year.



You (and your partner) will be expected to present your alphabet book to your classmates.
